Annual Report to College Admissions Staff 2009-2010

Toledo School for the Arts is a public community school sponsored by Bowling Green State University. Located in the heart of downtown Toledo, TSA offers open enrollment to any secondary student in Ohio, and has a student population of approximately 533 boys and girls. These students are in grades 6-12 from 22 different school districts, which represent a wide range of socio-economic and cultural backgrounds. Chartered by the State of Ohio, TSA provides a traditional education in a non-traditional environment where students pursue a college preparatory curriculum along with an intense arts program. In addition to the core academic subjects, classes are taught in Dance, Music, Theatre and the Visual Arts.

Major TSA donors include the Anderson, Entelco, Stanahan, and Terhune Foundations. TSA also has partnerships with Toledo's major cultural institutions including the Arts Commission of Greater Toledo, Ballet Theatre of Toledo, Toledo Ballet, Toledo Symphony, Toledo Repertoire Theatre, and The Toledo Museum of Art. Students are offered the opportunity to work with professional artists in order to expand their artistic knowledge, skills and experiences.

Mission Statement

The mission of the Toledo School for the Arts is to provide students with creative opportunities to achieve personal and academic success through arts-based learning. TSA prepares students as life-long learners and productive members of society with an appreciation for, and competence in, the arts.

Course Offerings

English: 9, 10, 11, 12; Science: Physical Science, Biology, Chemistry, Anatomy/Physiology, Physics; Math: Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry, Pre-Calculus, Trigonometry/Statistics; Social Studies: World Studies, American History, Government, Senior Humanities; Spanish: I, II & III; Health, Business, Marketing and art courses in ballet, modern and stage dance, instrumental and vocal music, jazz and commercial music, theatre and technical theatre, studio art, graphic design and photography.

2009 Academic Achievements

For the fourth year in a row, TSA was rated Excellent by the Ohio Department of Education on 2008-2009 Report Card (highest of five ratings), while also earning the distinction of a Blue Ribbon School.

Graduation rate of 100% in 2009, approximately 90% pursue higher education.

100% of the full time instructors are fully certified by the State of Ohio and considered "highly qualified."
