



2020 Fall Return Frequently Asked Questions

As of August 21, 2020

When is the first day of classes?

The 2020-2021 school year will begin on Monday, Aug. 31

What will the start of the year look like?

TSA will begin the 2020-2021 school year with all-virtual instruction through the end of the 1st quarter. Prior to the end of the 1st quarter, TSA will assess the decision and make a determination on the format of the 2nd quarter.

How will TSA determine whether or not to return to in-person instruction?

TSA will continue to consult with the Department of Health, the Ohio Department of Education, and the Governor's office as well as monitoring the COVID-19 case statistics in Lucas County.

Will virtual classes work at the same pace as in-person instruction?

The intention of the all-virtual model is to design and deliver a curriculum that mirrors as closely as possible that which students would experience in the face-to-face classroom. Faculty will utilize Zoom and out-of-class materials and assessments to ensure students achieve the required standards and objectives of each class.

How do I pick-up my iPad?

IPad's for returning students may be picked up at the front entrance of the school between 8-2 Monday-Friday. All students new to TSA will receive iPads' at the New Student Orientation on Thursday, August 27.

What is the schedule for New Student Orientation?

New Student Orientation will take place on Thursday, Aug 27.

For 6th grade students this will take place between 8:00-12:00; for students in grades 7-12 it will take place between 12:00-3:00.

Students are to report at the Dock entrance of Toledo School for the Arts. Lunch will be provided for 6th grade students.

Can virtual students still participate in extracurricular activities?

The availability of extra-curricular activities remains to be determined. All- virtual students will be eligible for extra-curricular activities. Faculty will make the final determination of what activities will be offered and in what format.
